Inclusive

Partnership working will ensure that all children and young people who want to can make music. Partners will work together to identify and break down any barriers to music-making that young people face. Partnership work should support a diversity of high-quality, authentic, music-making across a wide range of genres and musical activities

Collaborative

All partnership work will be co-created and designed with a common desired outcome, shared vision and values. Emphasis will be placed on the role of young people as co-creators ensuring that the voice of young people is truly represented in the development of new provision.

High Quality

High quality music education will be at the heart of all partnership work using <u>Arts Council England Quality Principles</u> as a reference point. Workforce development will be central to the design of partnership work. We will develop, innovate and advocate to influence the national debate on music education.

Evaluative

Partnership work will have reflective practise and evaluation at its heart. Our partners will actively demonstrate a commitment to continuous improvement, effective monitoring and evaluation, critical self-evaluation and peer review.

We will measure impact by planning projects that start with our overall aim and what we collectively value. We will collect meaningful data and share impact for the benefit of participants present and future.




Figure 1: Planning Triangle, NCVO
