Royal Birmingham Conservatoire Resources

We have been working with Royal Birmingham Conservatoire to run the Secondary Schools Ensemble for the past two years and we are now able to release the ensemble resources to all our secondary schools, whether you have been part of the project or not. These are really useful resources for ensembles in schools as they are differentiated to support all levels of playing abilities on a wide range of instruments. We are just sorting some technical issues (as there are over 50 files per ensemble piece and 6 pieces!) to make them easier to download off the website, but these will be launched before the end of this half term (October).
